World Book Day 2018

We had a great day in school on Thursday for World Book Day. Children and staff dressed up as their favourite book characters and there were lots of fun activities throughout the day for all age groups.

Nursery read several stories, had a vote on their favourites and recorded the results on a tally chart.

Reception designed their own bookmarks, created a storytelling mirror and some even wrote their own stories. The Y6 buddies came to read Reception their favourite story.

Year 1 wrote descriptive sentences about their favourite story character.

Year 2 focused on the brilliant author Julia Donaldson and shared with the children a number of different books that she has written. The Year 2 staff all dressed up as characters from Julia Donaldson books!

The children wrote a piece of descriptive writing about the character they came to school as and why, they then drew a picture of themselves in their costume.

Year 3 - Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone Day - Children wrote character descriptions of their own Harry Potter characters and then had to use these descriptions to draw each other's character. Then they had to draw the thing they wanted most in the world in the Mirror of Erised.

Year 4 - Read a short picture book and then used this as inspiration to write their own short books.

Year 5 - Created their own books/stories to actually look like mini books and in Maths they focused on statistics based around counting the number of words on different pages of different books, comparing them and then creating bar charts.

It was meetings as usual for the Senior Management Team though (below)! Also well done to Charlie G from 4VW who dressed as a Creaker – not only did he dress up as a character no one else had thought of – he emailed the author of the book (Tom Fletcher) and got a reply.
