Fitbits in school

There seems to have been a proliferation in the number of children wearing Fitbits in school. You do not have to do much Googling to find articles relating to the negative impact of Fitbits in school and on children, with some schools banning them because of children obsessing, linked to their use.

At present we are taking a pragmatic line. For the time being, we are not banning them. However, we are aware that they are a distraction, with some children checking in on them regularly. At present, we will tackle this on an individual basis and with children who find them too much of a distraction we will have to enforce a ban with them.

Given the above, if your child wears a Fitbit to school, please can you reinforce this message about appropriate use? We thank you in anticipation.

Some children use them primarily as a watch. With Christmas not that far away (sorry for mentioning the season!), I always recommend that parents buy an analogue watch (with hands) as a stocking filler (you can get them as cheaply as five or six pounds off Amazon), as this improves children's understanding of telling the time (obviously, the Fitbit is digital).

Shoe Boxes for Operation Christmas Child

This year St Mary's church are collecting shoe boxes filled with children's toys, toiletries and stationery to be sent to needy parts of the world with Operation Christmas Child, run by the charity Samaritan's Purse.

We would love families from the Coppice to join in and donate a completed shoe box, or a few items to go towards a box, if you can!

Shoe boxes should first be covered in wrapping paper so that look pretty but can still be opened – this is because the contents need to be checked before sending overseas.

Next, fill your shoe box with small items: TOYS, such as dolls or stuffed toys (with CE label), toy trucks, harmonica, yo-yo, skipping rope, ball, small puzzles etc. SCHOOL SUPPLIES such as pens, pencils & sharpeners, crayons or felt pens, stamps & ink pad sets, writing pads or notebooks & paper, solar calculators, colouring & picture books etc. HYGIENE ITEMS such as toothbrush and toothpaste, bars of wrapped soap, comb or hairbrush, flannel and OTHER ITEMS such as hat, cap, gloves or scarf, sunglasses, hair accessories, jewellery set, wind up torch, wrapped sweets (with long best before date)

Label the box 'Boy' or 'Girl' and the age range they are suitable for: Age 2-4, age 5-9 or age 10-14.

Completed boxes can be dropped off at the St Mary's entrance on Friday 3rd November from 8.30-9.30am or on Sunday 5th November from 10 – 10.30am before our main service. This is to allow enough time for Samaritan's Purse to sort and ship them before Christmas!
