As I mentioned in last week's newsletter, Thursday 3rd was the official National Poetry Day so we took full advantage of this fact and celebrated poetry all week! We started on Monday with poetry assemblies where teachers from all year groups 1 - 6 read a favourite poem to the children. In tribute to the stunning rainbow pictures we posted on the parent app a few days ago, I read a poem entitled, 'How do you make a rainbow?' A real highlight of these assemblies though were Mr. Lampard and Mr. Ruffles reading poems that they themselves had written, which I have to say were absolutely fantastic and again showed off their creative talents. Mr. Ruffles' poem was entitled 'What is joy?' and Mr. Lampard's was entitled 'Say something'. I have to say, both children and other staff were extremely impressed!

The week culminated this afternoon with all classes from Years 1 - 6 performing the poem that they had learnt to other classes of children. We had three performances, all of which included a Year 1 class, a Year 2 class, a Year 3 class, a Year 4 class, a Year 5 class and a Year 6 class. The performances were absolutely fantastic and it was pleasure to front these special occasions.

Without doubt, Poetry is a genre of language that can bring both children and adults so much in different ways and, therefore, it is something that we really want to ensure our children are exposed to.


#### Phonics workshop:


