Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a good week and also had a lovely half-term break with your children. The children have returned really well to school and it's clear that they are very much looking forward to the exciting term ahead.

OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) launch starting next week!

Next week marks the official start of our very exciting OPAL play three year journey. This will revolutionise the playtime experience for our children with the desired aim being to make it even more fun and engaging as well as achieving further enhanced positive outcomes in terms of learning. This is something that I have wanted for our school for some time and, after much physical development of the playground and some key logistical challenges ironed out, we are finally in a place to begin implementing it. Much more information will come over the coming months including a half a day's training for all staff, which will include lunchtime supervisors) on the second Teacher Education Day in September. This development will be one of the key areas of our next three year School Development Plan (SDP).

On Monday of next week, Kayleigh Atkinson (our OPAL Play Mentor) will be visiting school to observe lunchtimes between 12pm and 1pm and then have a review meeting with me as Head (Strategic Lead), Mrs. Ashwell (Curricular lead for Play), Miss. Carter (Play Coordinator) and Mrs. Lennon (PTA representative) to audit current policies, staffing and provision. During this time, she will be collating a baseline of where we are at at the current time in terms if our play provision in order that we can measure progress moving forward.

Sports Days:

Preparations for our sports days are already underway and the excitement is starting to build! Children have been starting to practise the different events with their teachers in their Physical Education (PE) lessons so that the children are primed and ready for some fantastic competition. As always, the children in Years 1-6 will be competing in their house teams where the House Sports Day Cup will be at stake. We can't wait for the games to begin and to, once again, welcome you all into school in order to enjoy these events and give your children your support.

Lower Key Stage 2 (Years 3 and 4): Monday 17th June 1.00 pm - 3pm

Upper Key Stage 2 (Years 5 and 6): Tuesday 18th June 1.00 pm – 3pm

Year 4 Upton Warren off-site trip:

Year 4 have had a fantastic three days at Upton Warren Outdoor Activity Centre this week and gained a huge amount from getting the chance to participate in a whole range of outdoor activities such as climbing, kayaking, and raft-building. The benefits to children of these types of activities cannot be underestimated as they offer something completely different to the classroom environment. In our experience, these trips give the children chance to build confidence, overcome fears and develop new skills and abilities. Many times, over the course of the three days, we often see a completely different side to some of our children. For example, and as I have said many times when talking about the benefits of this trip, I have never forgotten seeing one particular child, who I had previously seen in school as being quite quiet and shy, came alive and showed fantastic team leadership skills in a raft-building task. Therefore, these trips often reveal things about the children that we didn't know which, in turn, allows stronger relationships to be built between staff and children and a further opportunity to ensure that none of our children's talents go undiscovered.
