Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that you have all had a good week and are looking forward to the weekend with your children. It's been another busy week at The Coppice and, as always, there is lots to share with you all.

Sunny weather: protecting your children:

It has been a lovely feeling this week to have been blessed with some spring sunshine, which always gives everyone a lift and puts smiles on people's faces. Hopefully this will last into the Easter break that is coming around very quickly.

With the arrival of the sunny weather, and in advance of the summer term, I think it is a good time to remind all Parents and Carers about protecting their children from the sun's harmful rays and, therefore, of the school's policy with regards to the application of sunscreen. The school's policy is as follows:

- Children can bring in a bottle of sunscreen during the summer months. This MUST be an SPF of 30 or above.
- Children are allowed to re-apply sun cream once before lunchtime (a five minute window will be given) if
 Parents or Carers wish them to do so, especially those children with sensitive skin and those who are at high
 risk of sunburn. Parents will remind their children to do this when the weather is particularly warm.
- Sun cream bottles must be labelled and will be kept in a safe place in the classroom. Sun cream brought into school should be left in school for the duration of the Summer Term teachers/staff will not be responsible for reminding children to take sun cream home at the end of each day.
- Parents should apply an application of the product before school and pupils should be taught, at home, how to apply a 'top up', should it be required,
- Staff will assist Foundation Stage (Nursery & Reception) pupils with the application of sun cream by giving them guidance. However, they will not be able to apply this directly the child MUST do this themselves. If they are not capable of this, Parents/Carers will need to come to school to provide the further application. In other year groups the children are responsible for their own application.
- 'Roller ball' applications are particularly good for young children as they are easier to use. You can buy branded ones and there are also ones called 'solar buddies', which you can fill with a lotion of your choosing.
- Staff cannot be responsible for sun cream applied incorrectly by a child.
- Children should be taught at home never to share sun cream and we will reinforce this in school as well.
- Sunscreen will be applied <u>before</u> lunch and it won't be the responsibility of Lunchtime supervisors to do this.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation with the above guidelines - it is much appreciated and goes a long way to ensuring that we are a 'sun safe' school. Please also continue to send your child in with caps, sun hats and water bottles when the weather is warm as these all contribute to your child's safety and comfort.

Summer uniform.

Just a reminder that, when we return from Easter, this also marks the move from Winter uniform to Summer uniform for children who want to wear it. As you walked around the school today, it was impossible not to notice the enthusiasm from all the children, fully engaged in the practical experiments and investigations planned for each year group.
