Athletics success for The Coppice - again!

On Friday 12th April, both the girls and the boys went to Bromsgrove School to represent 'Redditch' in the Worcestershire County School Games. We were supported by lots of Parents and Carers and the atmosphere was electric!! The games began with the girls' obstacle race and the boys' first-round field events. All morning, the children were coming back with first, second and third places and Mr Edwards, Miss Franklin and Miss Wells were secretly confident with what the overall results might be. When the results were called, the girls were announced as county champions and the boys came a wonderful second place, just missing out on first place to Aston Fields by 2 points. Florence Nightingale visits Year 1!

On Wednesday, each Year 1 class enjoyed travelling back in time with the famous 'Lady with the lamp: 'Florence Nightingale'. Through an immersive drama workshop, the children learnt about her life, career and how she transformed nursing and the sanitation of our hospitals. It started with taking them back to how life was in the Victorian era to show how she cared for soldiers in the Crimean War. All of the children were very imaginative and engrossed in the experience, which was lovely to see. The children completed the session by learning how to care for wounded soldiers by putting bandages on their friends. Luckily, they all recovered! As you can see, everyone had a fantastic time bringing their history curriculum to life.



Year 4 Egyptian Day:

On Egyptian day Year 4 did three activities. Firstly, the children sketched the death mask of King Tutankhamun. Secondly, they learned about hieroglyphics. They cracked a hieroglyphic code, wrote their name in hieroglyphics and made a bookmark. Finally, they conducted a STEM (Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) project where they had to use marshmallows and dried spaghetti to make a pyramid as stable and big as possible. All the staff had fun and loved seeing all the children dressed in their Egyptian costumes!



Year 4 Hockey tournament:

On Tuesday 16th April, six Year 4 children went to Redditch Hockey and Football club to a Quicksticks hockey competition. There were two groups with 5 teams in each. Coppice fought hard in the first round and won all games except the last one against Batchley First School. In the semi-final, Coppice played Vaynor. They beat Coppice 3-2 meaning Coppice came third. The children were really well mannered and a credit to the Coppice.
