This joint initiative between The Coppice, Woodrush and Wythall Parish Council is part of an ongoing drive to improve car-parking and safety around our school. We therefore appeal again to all Parents and Carers not to park in prohibited areas outside our school and in the local streets, and to walk to school where possible. Please also respect people like PC Head when reminders are given - he is only trying to ensure that none of our children or community gets hurt.

Some of you may also have seen the article in the local Parish Magazine (pictured right) which talked in detail about why they have invested in these signs for our school.
